Black for outstanding courage to withstand Mental and Moral strength to Venture, Persevere, and withstand danger, fear, and difficulty, in order to accomplish, and execute fully his duty while stationed with the 38th. Air Rescue Unit in Southeast Asia, at Da Nang Air Station under the Command of Major Ronald L. Ingraham, who requested this award be given to A/2C Black. Airman Black was one of the unfortunate men on the 28, January, 1966, to be shot down while on a Mission to Rescue the Pilot of an F-100 Super Saber. Airman Black displayed great courage while under fire and wounded while getting out of the H-43 Helicopter on which he was stationed. It hear-by gives me great pleasure to award this Plaque to A/2C Black who displayed great service to his Country and the United States Air Force.
