SUBJECT: Mission Narrative Report (1-3-113, 25Jul67) (U)

TO: 3rd ARRGp (RCRC) APO 96307

1. (U) This report is submitted IAW 3rd ARRGp Supl 1, ARPSM 55-1, 27 Apr 67.

2. (C) We received notification at 2115Z that an F-4, callsign Maverick 1 was down on the 335°R/341M/Ch 109. At that time there was neither visual nor electronic contact with the downed aircrews. After the normal pre-takeoff briefings, Jolly Green 25 (Low) and Jolly Green 30 (Hi) was airborne at 2227Z, estimating 1+10 enroute to the scene. While enroute, we received word from Crown 4, the Airborne Missions Commander, that there was one survivor in the water. This turned out to be an erroneous report. Since the scene was within one half mile from the shore, I requested some RESCORT from Crown 4. A flight of 3 F-4C's, callsign Chisel 1, 2 and 3 and 2 F-8's, callsign Condole 050 were assigned. Upon our arrival at the scene at 2318Z and upon direction from Crown 4, with Chisel 1 as CAP, I went to the area which was clearly marked by an oil slick. A packet of dye marker was still diluting in the center of the oil slick. No sign of any survivor or remains were noted among the debris in the area. We did not receive ground fire from the many fisherman that could be seen on the beach. Since we did not locate any evidence that there were any survivors in the area, we departed the area at 2350Z for Ch 109, arriving there at 0015Z.

3. (U) Weather at the launch and recovery bases was good. Weather in the vicinity and at the crash scene was three thousand scattered to broken with light rain showers. The visibility within the rain showers was one mile or better and was not considered a factor from the JG standpoint.
