1. (U) This report is submitted in accordance with ARRSN 55-2/3ARRGp Sup 1, dated 15 Apr 68.

2. (C) At 0825Z, JGs 22 and 28 were scrambled from DaNang. A Marine H-34, call sign Murray 47, had been hit by ground fire and was reported down at a position 352/14/77. JG 22 arrived at the crash site at 0840Z. Another Marine H-34, call sign Murray 48, was just entering a hover over the survivors and was in the process of lowering his hoist. Murray 48 accomplished a successful hoist pickup of one survivor. JG 22 then landed at 0844Z, picked up the remaining two survivors and departed the area at 0845Z. Both survivors appeared in excellent condition and were returned to Marble Mountain Marine Air Station. A fourth survivor was reported picked up earlier by a UH-1 call sign Coachman 858. Spad 11 was On Scene Commander and remained in the area, following the rescue, in an attempt to locate the source of the ground fire.

Summary Report 1-3-094-8241, 28 August 68

At 0825Z, Jolly Green 22 and 28 were launched to assist in the rescue of four crewmembers of a USMC helicopter which had been downed by ground fire. Upon arrival at the crash site, Jolly Green 22 observed one survivor being rescued by a USMC helicopter. One other survivor had been previously rescued by an Army helicopter. Jolly Green 22 with Jolly Green 28 as escort landed at the site and effected the rescue of the two remaining crewmembers. Survivors were Maj. J.L. Harrison, 065968, and Lt. B.F. Rose, 103189, both USMC.
