MISSION NARRATIVE 9-38-010, 30 OCT 68

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2. At 1000Z, Det 9, 38 ARRSq was notified of a downed US Army UH-1 helicopter, Callsign Buchaneer 28, at 108-05E - 13-32N. At 1015Z we determined that it was a valid SAR objective and at 1020Z Pedro 74, tail number 63-9717 was launched. At 1040Z Pedro 74 reached the crash site and landed at 1045Z. With the help of US Army personnel, the PJ and FE placed the injured UH-1 crewmember aboard Pedro 74. At 1050Z Pedro departed the crash site enroute to the 71st Field Hospital at Pleiku AB. During the recovery, Pedro 98 orbited north of the crash site. The injured crewmember had suffered a severe lower back injury, but it could not be determined if it involved a fracture. He was in pain but apparently not suffering from shock. At 1115Z Pedro 74 landed at the 71st Hospital at Pleiku and the patient was transferred. At 1125Z Pedro 74 terminated the mission. There were two other injured crewmembers aboard the UH-1, but the injuries were minor and ambulatory, they were evacuated by an Army helicopter. There was no known enemy ground fire during the recovery, but the area was considered highly unsecure.
3. Survivors: WO-1 L. D. Farmer, serial number unknown, 170th Assault Helicopter Company, US Army. The names of the other survivors are unknown.
4. Weather was not a factor but the rescue occurred after sunset and there was very little day light remaining.

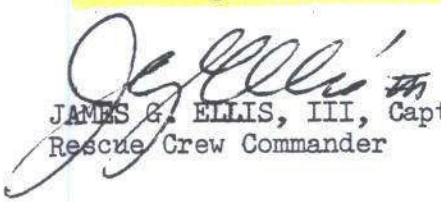
