SUBJECT: Mission Narrative Report (7-38-002-9002) 4 January 1969

TO: 3ARRGp

1. At 1525Z (2325L) the 366th USAF Dispensary called and advised me that they had a life and death requirement to transport US Army Specialist Forth Class Joseph D. Von Schultz to the NSA hospital. The patient was suffering from a self-inflicted 38 caliber gunshot wound in the left eye. A tracheotomy was being performed at the time so arrangements were made to meet an ambulance with the patient at the Danang south ramp area in ten minutes. Pedro 69 scrambled at 1530Z and flew to the south ramp. The ambulance arrived at 1535Z and the victim and a dispensary medic were unloaded. The pararescueman administered aid using a hand operated respirator. After detecting intermittent cardiac arrest, the PJ's request to have a cardiac stimulating device ready upon landing at NSA was relayed through Marble Mountain Tower. After landing the PJ went with the patient as he was carried into the hospital and continued working the respirator. The patient was released to two neurosurgeons and a crew of attendants. The PJ later returned to the helicopter. We flew to the south ramp to drop off the medic before securing at our Nogales alert helopad at 1606Z. Weather was not a factor in this mission.
