1. This report is submitted IAW ARRSN 55-2, 3rd ARRGp Sup 1, 11 July 1968.
2. At 2150, Pedro Ops was requested by Navy Binh Thuy Command Post to recover one Navy personnel suffering from deteriorating head injuries at coordinates WS 504460. Pedro 39 departed Binh Thuy 2155 for above coordinates. While enroute we were able to determine from the Navy Command Post that the landing area was a Navy ship with a light heli-copter landing pad. Radio contact was made with the Navy ship and a starboard approach (into the wind) was accomplished. Visibility in the area was clear with light haze over the water. After landing, the survivor was litter-loaded aboard by two Navy personnel. On return to the 29th Army Field Hospital, light ground fire was observed while out of range. The patient was off loaded at the hospital and Pedro 39 returned to Binh Thuy terminating at 2245. 2 sorties, 0.8 hours flying time, 1 non-combat save credited.
