1. This report is submitted IAW ARRS 55-2, 3 ARRGP Sup 1, 11 July 1968.
2. At 1815L, Navy Binh Thuy called Pedro Ops and requested pick up of one wounded Navy personnel at WS 623 798. Pedro 39 launched at 1820L for rescue coordinates. Enroute weather was 3500' broken 5 miles visibility with haze. Pedro 39 arrived at coordinates at 1845L. A tactical approach was made, landing adjacent to a canal. The wounded was on loaded by the PJ and FE. Pedro 39 departed the area at 1850L. Enroute to the 29th Army Field Hospital the PJ with the assistance of the FE, administered life sustaining medical attention. The survivor had multiple shrapnel wounds of the head with a concussion. Pedro 39 arrived at the 29th Army Field Hospital at 1920L, off loading the wounded. Pedro 39 departed the 29th at 1922L, terminating at Binh Thuy at 1925L. Negative ground fire encountered. One combat save credited. 2 sorties, 1.1 flying hours.
