SUBJECT: Mission Narrative 7-38-030-03 Apr 69

TO: 3ARRGP/JSARC *JOS*

1. At 0745Z 03 Apr 69 Det 7, 38ARRS, was informed by OL 1, 3ARRGP, (Queen), that a medevac was imminent. At 0748 OL 1 again called, with full particulars on the medevac. Four Marines stationed at MACSS 4, Son Tra Mountain, were victims of gunshot wounds, and two were critical. Pedro 69 was scrambled at 0750Z and proceeded to LZ 12 On Son Tra Mountain, (Monkey Mountain), near MACSS 4. Upon arrival the helicopter crew found that there were four litter patients and one ambulatory. The two most critical litters were on-loaded and flown to the NSA Hospital, Marble Mountain, AAF, about six miles away. Pedro 69 then returned and transported the remaining two litter patients and the ambulatory patient. One of the critical patients, 1Lt T.A. Ross, 09433, USMC, was being given artificial respiration when Pedro 69 arrived. The PJ on board continued this in the helicopter, but was getting no response, so he also applied heart massage, the pilot radioed to the hospital to have tracheotomy gear and oxygen waiting on arrival. It was later learned that the man had died. One other patient, SSgt J.W. Roney, USMC, 1821289, was also critically injured, and is claimed as a USMC Non-combat, Nonaircrew save. The other patients transported were Capt S.M. Lambereth, USMC, Capt J.F. Giles, USMC, and LCPL J.R. Wall, USMC. After releasing the last three patients to the NSA Hospital, Pedro 69 returned to the Det 7 helipad, and terminated at 0826Z.

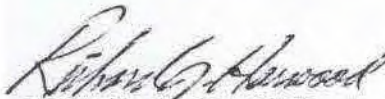
SUBJECT: Mission Narrative Report (2-3-027, 3 Apr 69)

TO: Det 1-40 (C)

1. This report is submitted IAW ARRSM 55-2/3rd ARRG Sup 1, dated 11 July 1968.
2. Jolly Green 37 was scrambled from NKP by Det 1, 40th ARRS Duty Controller for a medical evacuation from Ram Chit Chi Army Camp to Korat RTAFB. Prior coordination and approval had been obtained from Compress. Jolly Green 37 was airborne at 1010Z and landed and picked up the patient at Ram Chit Chi at 1030Z. The patient was in a semi-conscious state from causes unknown, and had complained of severe pains in his neck, arms and legs. Landing at Korat and off loading of the patient at the hospital helicopter pad was at 1230Z. Jolly Green then landed on the base transient ramp for refueling at 1240Z. Final take-off was at 1325Z and final landing at NKP RTAFB was at 1555Z. Weather enroute was 5-12000 feet scattered to broken. Flight to Korat was at 3000 feet and return to NKP was at 9-10,000 feet to avoid the 0-8000 feet restricted airspace in Thailand at night. No difficulty was encountered, since a full moon allowed visual avoidance of clouds and thundershowers building up. The remainder of the flight was routine.
