



CITATION TO ACCOMPANY THE AWARD OF  
THE DISTINGUISHED FLYING CROSS  
(POSTHUMOUS)  
TO  
TECHNICAL SERGEANT HARRY H. COHEN

Technical Sergeant Harry H. Cohen distinguished himself by heroism while participating in aerial flight as a Pararescueman at U-Tapao Airfield, Thailand, on 19 July 1969. On that date, Sergeant Cohen was on a crew of a HH-43 helicopter participating in a rescue of crewmembers of a burning B-52, which was fully loaded with bombs. The helicopter, because of reduced visibility from the driving rain, hovered directly over the burning B-52, ensuring that all the crewmembers had been evacuated. Following successful evacuation of the aircrew, the bomb load of the burning aircraft exploded and, because of the heroic efforts of the helicopter aircrew in moving their aircraft closely into the crash scene to affect the rescue, the helicopter was fatally struck by debris. Sergeant Cohen was killed in action as a result of this explosion. The outstanding heroism and selfless devotion to duty displayed by Sergeant Cohen reflect great credit upon himself and the United States Air Force.
