



CITATION TO ACCOMPANY THE AWARD OF
THE SILVER STAR
(FIRST OAK LEAF CLUSTER)
TO
ANGUS C. MCDOUGALL

Sergeant Angus C. McDougall distinguished himself by gallantry in connection military operations against an opposing armed force as a rescue specialist aboard an HH-3E Rescue Helicopter in Southeast Asia on 14 March 1968. On that date, Sergeant McDougall penetrated an extremely hostile area to attempt the rescue of a downed pilot. After the rescue helicopter had been damaged and third disabled by hostile fire, a fourth helicopter was shot down during the rescue attempt. With complete disregard for his own personal safety, Sergeant MdDougall, without hesitation, attempted to recover the crew of the downed helicopter. After a hover was established with one gear on the side of a hill in tall elephant grass and underbrush, Sergeant McDougall provide covering fire with the injured crewmen were brough on board in the face of heavy hostile fire. By his gallantry and devotion to duty, Sergeant McDougall reflected great credit upon himself and the United States Air Force.

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
